COPETON WATERS HOLIDAY PARK (CWHP)

We would like to welcome you to CWHP. We come under the jurisdiction of the Department of Lands and all monies received by CWHP are retained by us to be used to improve park facilities and benefit visitors.

Swimming in fresh water lakes can often be dangerous and with the lake being deep and cold we recommend you supervise children at all times. As the water level decreases many rocky outcrops and tree stumps are only just beneath the surface so swimmers and boat operators are advised to take precautions at all times.

OFFICE & KIOSK HOURS - 8.30am - 5.00pm weekdays and 4.00pm winter 8.00am - 6.00pm summer weekends and holidays

Closing times are subject to alterations.

POWERED SITES are situated in Jaycee Park and Copeton Bay.

CAMPING permits must be obtained from the Office and adhesive stickers must be displayed on your tent or caravan indicating payment of fees. Fees will be charged from the day your camp is set up. If you arrive after 5.00pm and the office is closed establish your site and attend the office the next morning to pay your fees and collect your permit and boom gate pin number.

Entrance to park **before 5.00am and after 10.00pm** is only by arrangement with park staff, phone 02 6723 6269 during office hours.

Camping is not permitted at the following sites:-

- 1. The area surrounding the Camp Kitchen
- 2. The area surrounding the cabins and on-site vans.
- 3. Within 50 metres of any boat ramp or road entering the water.
- 4. Within 50 metres of any Powered Sites, Shelter sheds or amenities blocks.
- 5. Anywhere a "No Camping" sign is displayed.

You may camp as close to the water as you wish providing there is no large inflow occurring. Generators are prohibited in the vicinity of all powered sites and from the Park entrance to the tennis courts.

ALL GENERATORS, LOUD MUSIC, EXCESSIVE NOISE MUST CEASE BY 10.00PM. FAILURE TO COMPLY WILL LEAD TO EVICTION.

Treated drinking water is available at Jaycee Park and Copeton Bay amenities.

All other taps are untreated storage water and must be used with caution.

ROAD RULES are enforceable within the park so please drive slowly and carefully,

STRICTLY NO RIDING IN BACK OF UTES OR BOATS BEING TOWED.

DOGS are permitted and must be kept on a leash and under control.

NATIVE ANIMALS & VEGETATION are here for your enjoyment and are not to be interfered with, they are wild animals and should be treated as such.

FIREARMS are not permitted in the park.

FIRE REGULATIONS must be adhered to at all times. Fires are permitted on the non-grassed areas only and where danger does not exist.

CHILDREN using the playground facilities including the jumping pillow and splash park must be supervised by adults at all times.

CHAINSAWS are not to be used within boundaries of the park by patrons.

Patrons are informed that a risk is associated with any form of activity and under the new civil liability amendment (Bill 2002) patrons must take personal responsibility for their actions.
